

Ashes' Story

SAVE, A Friend to Homeless Animals, Inc., Skillman, NJ

Three-year-old Ashes arrived at SAVE, A Friend to Homeless Animals, Inc. from another local shelter on February 13, 2016. She was originally rescued from a serious hoarding situation, and, consequently, developed an upper respiratory infection and a grade III/VI heart murmur. Ashes had an echocardiogram to see if she was well enough for her teeth to be cleaned. These procedures were successful along with the removal of several teeth. She is much happier and more active because she feels better both physically and emotionally. She is more trusting of visitors and is well positioned to find a loving home with a new family. Due to her sensitive mouth, and the threat of a serious infection, Ashes will have the remainder of her teeth removed.
